

Measure B Coalition Meeting 8/17/18

- Focus of meeting was to narrow down on points for joint letter(s) and presentation to STA.
- Jim analyzed and distilled points from “How to Pass a Mega Transportation Measure”
 - Group discussed similarities and differences, including the role of Metro vs. RT
 - Decided that Measure M is still an important model to replicate and that members of this coalition need to be well-versed in the intricacies of the measure and how it relates to opportunities here in Sacramento.
 - Action Item: Develop a matrix that compares and contrasts the steps of Measure M with the steps being taken here in Sacramento. This will identify the gaps and areas for this coalition to advocate for action.

Developed Regional Framework	

- Need to create a Regional Framework = high level goals + buckets and selection criteria + policies
- General agreement that a Regional Framework should follow:
 - High level goals/objectives (derived from MTP/SCS + Measure M)
 - Buckets - pots of funding for allocating resources that are in alignment with Regional Framework
 - Selection Criteria for ensuring that allocations within buckets are done so in a manner that is consistent with the Regional Framework
 - Policies/Process: assurances within both the measure and process that drive implementation, public engagement, etc.
- Outline for letter to STA
 - Measure B Failure, Measure M success
 - Regional Framework and selection criteria
 - Why important, MTP/SCS, 2050 scoping plan, regional buy-in
 - Public Engagement process for developing the regional framework Selling the measure
 - Messaging, Harvey matrix
- Potential workflow/timeline for Coalition efforts:
 - Get STA and jurisdictional buy-in on Regional Framework
 - Develop selection criteria
 - Identify unmet needs (buckets) + vet with community
- STA presentations

 - 2 - Return the following month with our outline for the regional framework. Accountability for process

- In developing Regional Framework and list of goals and policies, we have to be careful to differentiate between goals and policies for the measure and for the process.
- Initial list of goals
 - VMT Neutrality
 - Equity as a priority
 - Front load state of good repair and Bike/Ped/Transit investments (may be a policy)
 - Data driven process that relies on robust selection criteria
 - Improves roadway safety
 - Improves our roads
 - Creates a stronger transit system
 - Identifies specific projects and creates pots of competitive funds for others (policy)
 - Transparency/Iterative process (policy)
 - Creates more economically prosperous communities
